

Trio Stealth-10 Speaker Replacement

This guide will detail the steps to replace the speaker on the Trio Stealth 10.

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INTRODUCTION

If the speaker on your Trio Stealth-10 is no longer functioning, replacement isn't difficult and this guide will give you the step by step procedure to do so.



TOOLS:


- iFixit Opening Tools (1)
- Soldering Iron (1)
- 64 Bit Driver Kit (1)

Step 1 — Back Panel



 To remove the back panel, you will need to use a plastic opening tool and slowly separate the back panel from the device.


Step 2 — Speaker



This next step will require you to solder a couple of wires off the motherboard. We recommend you

- get someone to help you if you are unfamiliar with soldering or use Ifixit's <u>Soldering guide</u> to help you.
- Next you must solder off the wires that connect the speaker to the motherboard.

Step 3



 Next you will need to remove the two screws attached to the speaker. If you have a 54 bit Driver Kit use the Philips Head 0 (or PH 0) head to remove the two 4mm screws.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
