

# How to Reattach a Broken Piece of Wood

Learn how to reattach a wood fragment that has broken off a piece of wood furniture.

#### **INTRODUCTION**

These instructions provide a simple technique for reattaching a broken piece of wood to any type of furniture. We demonstrate this technique on a nightstand, but it can be used on any wooden surface that needs to be fixed. No carpentry skill is required to complete this repair.



### **TOOLS:**

- Cleaning Rag (1)
- Wood Glue (1)
- Small Paintbrush (1)
- Utility Knife (1)

Optional

• Spring Clamps (1)

### Step 1 — How to Reattach a Broken Piece of Wood





- Dust the surface of the fragment and the damaged area of the furniture.
  - Any household cleaner will work; we recommend a damp rag.

↑ Clean carefully, making sure not to cause further damage by splintering the fragment.

#### Step 2





- Check that the fragment fits well into the break in the furniture.
  - (i) If the fragment does not fit perfectly, cut away any irregular slivers on the fragment using a utility knife to achieve as neat of a fit as possible.

#### Step 3







- Apply glue to both the fragment and the furniture.
  - Check that the glue is spread evenly throughout both pieces.
  - (i) Using a brush to spread the glue to all crevices is most effective.

# Step 4



Insert the wood fragment into the glued spot on the furniture.

# Step 5



- Wipe away any excess glue using a damp rag.
  - ⚠ Be careful not to move the fragment out of alignment as you are wiping.

### Step 6





- Clamp the two pieces together.
  - You can use any type of clamp that you have on hand. If you don't have a clamp, any type of clip would work.
  - Wait 30 minutes for the glue to dry before removing the clamp.

⚠ Be careful not to bump the fragment out of alignment as you are clamping.

Continue using furniture as you had before!
